# Am I Eligible to Study at TUM? What are the Requirements?

Do I qualify for university studies in Germany?

- Anabin.de (German)
- DAAD Admission Requirements (English)
- <u>Uni-Assist Check</u> (German or English)





### Possible results from Anabin / DAAD research

· Direct general admission to German universities

You may apply for any degree program, a VPD and language certificate are still required.

Direct subject-restricted admission

You may apply for a specific degree program or limited range of programs, e.g. "Architecture and related courses".

Access with 1 previous year of university in your home country

You may apply after completing 1 year of university

General admission to a preparatory course

You may apply for the <u>Studienkolleg program</u>, a 1 year preparatory course.



### Language Proficiency Requirements

German:
German C1 language certificate
or
previous German language degree

English + German A2: B.Sc. Aerospace B.Sc. Information Engineering English:
English grades in school
or
previous English language diploma

Aptitude assessment:
English language skills checked by school
grades and/or interview

## **Proof of Language Skills**

- Requirement for admission (no conditional admission possible)
- English language certificates no longer required
- Upload in your online application <u>before the application deadline</u>
- Helpful online tool: <u>TUM Language Skill Navigator</u>
- List of accepted language certificates (Goethe, TELC, Test DaF) available online:

Language requirements are not just important for admission – <u>your success at TUM depends on them</u>.

Please make sure that your language skills are sufficient to succeed – especially in German!



# VPD Application Process at Uni-assist

#### What is the VPD?

- A document called preliminary review documentation ("Vorprüfungsdokumentation = VPD")
- Official conversion of your diploma and grades to the German system

#### Who needs to get a VPD?

- Mandatory if you obtained your school diploma outside of Germany (except German schools)
- Not required for a Studienkolleg application
- Applying for VPD from uni-assist is a separate step in the application process

## How to Apply for VPD at Uni-assist

Apply online on uni-assist website

Upload documents at uni-assist (school diploma)

Pay the application fee to uni-assist


Uni-assist needs 4-6 weeks to issue a VPD, please apply in time

You can apply before/during TUM application period (select any semester)

The VPD valid for 3 years and can be used to apply again at TUM (even for another bachelor's degree program)

## **TUMonline Application**

Register in TUMonline portal

https://campus.tum.de/

(one account for each user)

Upload documents until the application deadline (one file only for each document)

Application only possible during the application period

Uploaded documents are checked automatically

Personalized list of required documents is generated

If status is "incorrect", you can upload a new document

Mistakes in your application may only be corrected after the admission office has checked your documents



### TUMonline Application – Suggestions and Hints

#### Apply as early as possible (VPD and TUMonline)

- You will get a list of required documents and have time to prepare them. Earlier applications are processed much faster.
- You will have more time to replace incorrect documents

#### Upload all documents and check them carefully

- Incomplete applications will not be considered at all
- Already accepted documents cannot be replaced (e.g. motivation letter)
- You can still upload documents until the deadline

## **Aptitude Assessment**

#### Stage 1


Amount of points accumulated from:

- Your school grades in the last 2 years + final grade
- · Required documents submitted in application

Direct admission/rejection

or invitation to stage 2 (usually interview)

Stage 2 (interview or test)



For details refer to the degree program database and the homepage of your department.

If your school curriculum does not match the German curriculum, the interview is often mandatory



### **Tuition Fees**

### Who pays tuition fees

 International students with a non-EU/EEA nationality in a bachelor's or master's degree

### Exempt nationalities

 Citizens of member states of the EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway

### Exempt groups

- Non-EU students with a German school or bachelor's degree (completed)
- Students with an "established domestic connection to Germany" (required 5+ years residency and employment)
- Students with officially recognized disabilities (official medical proof required)



### Fee structure

### Bachelor's degree programs are categorized in two fee categories

Category 1:

2,000€/semester

Category 2:

3,000€/semester



Total cost for 6 semesters (regular duration)



Category 1:

12,000€

Category 2:

18,000€

The semester fee (in Munich area currently 85€) also has to be paid every semester



## **Payment Timeline**

First payment:
After admission to enrol for the first semester

Re-enrolment:
Payment of the fees for the next semester

Payment deadlines: Identical to the semester fee deadline (February 15<sup>th</sup> / August 15<sup>th</sup>)

Waivers and scholarships application available online

After admission, you will receive specific info and payment details through your TUMonline account and an official e-mail notification.

#### **Waivers**

Tuition fees are waived due to special reasons (e.g. financial hardship, refugee status)

### **Exemptions**

Tuition fees are waived due to your status (e.g. longtime German residency, disabilities)

### **Scholarships**

Students with excellent grades can apply for a scholarship

Please note – we cannot precheck if you are eligible for a waiver, exemption or scholarship.

After you apply online, you will receive a reliable result.



## Special info for German university graduates

Students with a **successfully completed** German bachelor's degree are exempt from tuition fees at TUM

Important: You have to graduate first to be exempt
Only students who have already graduated from their German degree are exempt

To receive the exemption, please enroll with your German bachelor's degree certificate and bachelor's diploma or provisional certificate /diploma ("Abschlussbescheinigung/Vorläufiges Abschlusszeugnis")

A transcript from a German university is not sufficient for the exemption

The exemption will be granted during enrollment after your final documents from your German bachelor's have been checked.



## Special Info for International School Graduates in Germany

Students who graduated from an international school **located in Germany** may also be exempt from the tuition fees


You upload your CV and international school diploma (IB diploma / A-Levels/ Baccalaureat Français) from an international school located in Germany.

The TUM admissions office will check where the school was located and notify you whether you qualify for an exemption. You will see the exemption in TUMonline when the fees are displayed.

Only students who graduated from a school physically located in Germany are eligible.
